First-Ever Fundraiser Raises Crucial Funds for The Collections

The first-ever fundraiser for The Lobkowicz Collections foundation, Lobkowicz Collections, o.p.s., was held in London on 18 June under the auspices of Royal Museums Greenwich (RMG), where Antonio Canaletto's masterpiece **London: The Thames on Lord Mayor's Day** (c. 1750) is on loan through 9 September 2012. After enjoying a private viewing of the painting and the exhibition *Royal River: Power, Pageantry and the Thames*, attendees continued on to a gala dinner in the historic 17th-century Queen's House, where the exceptional Brodowski Quartet performed excerpts from Beethoven's *Opus 18 String Quartets*. The generosity of RMG has allowed the full amount of the funds raised to be committed to the special projects and educational programs of Lobkowicz Collections, o.p.s.

Piranesi Conservation Project Fully Funded and Only Weeks from Completion

Ten individual donors have contributed 91,000 Czech crowns (approximately 4,500 USD) to Lobkowicz Collections, o.p.s. for the conservation of the <u> 18^{th} -century prints</u> by Giovanni Battista Piranesi. Eighteen of the twenty-six prints have already undergone conservation and hang once again in the Piranesi Room at Lobkowicz Palace. The remaining eight prints are currently at the conservator's studio and are due to be reinstalled at the Palace in mid-September.

Spotlight On: Lobkowicz-Pernštejn House Altar

Among the many evolutions in the artistic world during the Renaissance was the development of new ways of incorporating natural materials into the decorative arts. One such innovation was the "Florentine mosaic", or *pietra dura*, an inlay technique that uses finely cut minerals and semi-precious stones to create colorful mosaics. A fine example of this art form can be seen in the Lobkowicz-Pernštejn house altar, which Rudolf II gave to Zdeněk Vojtěch, 1st Prince Lobkowicz (1568–1628) – then the High Chancellor of Bohemia – and Polyxena Pernštejn on the occasion of their marriage in 1603.

The Lobkowicz-Pernštejn altar was almost certainly made in the workshop of Florentine artist Giovanni Castrucci, who played an important role in the artistic court of Rudolf II. Measuring just over half a meter high, a size that allowed for its portability, the altar was fashioned from ebony and embellished with a kaleidoscope of minerals, including amethyst, chalcedony and jasper. The right third of the central mosaic, with its tranguil scene of a countryside and a church tower, lies in stark contrast to the menacing dragon emerging from a cave on the left. At the heart of this image, Saint Margaret of Antioch, her hands clasped in prayer, kneels before a cross encircled by a

crown of thorns and canopied by the Latin phrase *"in boc signo vinces"*, meaning *"in this sign you will conquer"*. Three further smaller images created using the *pietra dura* technique can be seen on the altar's base. These depict an imaginary town (center) and the Lobkowicz and Pernštejn coats of arms (left and right, respectively). The Lobkowicz arms were clearly later adapted to incorporate the chain of the Order of the Golden Fleece, which the 1st Prince was awarded some twenty years after his marriage.

The decorative features of the altar are not limited to inlay work alone. The architectural details of this important example of the period's prevailing Mannerist style are also significant: scrolled modillions and vases enhance the base, while two columns stand on either side of the central image, and a two-tiered gable tops the superior part. A similar house altar can be found in the treasury of the Kremsmünster Abbey in Upper Austria. Likely created by Ottavio Miseroni, another great artist in the court of Rudolph II, the central scene shows a mosaic of Saint Jerome.

The Collections altar is exhibited in Lobkowicz Palace to the right of <u>this portrait</u> of Rudolf II, who, in a highly unusual decision for a person of his elevated status, chose to attend the wedding of the 1st Prince and his betrothed, a decision that reflected the importance he attached to the Lobkowicz and Pernštejn families' many generations of service to their Habsburg forebears. The altar, which would have been used for private devotions, can be seen in the Lobkowicz Rožmberk Room.
